1. **Friday, November 11th is Veterans Day. Ceremonies that were planned have been cancelled due to the anticipated weather. Below is an excerpt from President Biden's Proclamation. Thank you to all who have served our country.**

“Today, we honor generations of patriots who have earned the title of “American Veteran” — a badge of courage that unites the finest group of former service members the world has ever known. With their selfless sacrifice, our Armed Forces have forged and defended the very idea of America — a promise of freedom and equality, democracy and justice, possibility, and hope. We owe them an incredible debt that can never be fully repaid.

In every generation, America's veterans have been willing to give all for that which we hold sacred — freedom, justice, and democracy. They have served selflessly, sacrificed greatly, and shouldered the burden of freedom quietly, asking no glory for themselves. Today, let us honor them by living up to their example — putting service before self, caring for our neighbors, and working passionately to build a more perfect Union worthy of all those who protect our lives and liberty.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JOSEPH R. BIDEN JR., President of the United States of America, do hereby proclaim November 11, 2022, as Veterans Day. I encourage all Americans to recognize the valor, courage, and sacrifice of these patriots through appropriate ceremonies and private prayers, and by observing two minutes of silence for our Nation's veterans.”

2. Florence Township Water and Sewer routinely monitors for the presence of federal and state regulated drinking water contaminants. New Jersey adopted a standard, or MCL, for PFOA in 2020 and monitoring began in 2021. The MCL for PFOA is 0.014 parts per billion (ppb) and is based on a running annual average (RAA), in which the four most recent quarters of monitoring data are averaged. On September 13, 2022, we received notice that the sample collected on August 24, 2022 showed that our system exceeds the PFOA levels. The RAA for PFOA based on samples collected over the last four quarters to be 0.015 ppb. After receiving notice, Florence Township immediately began testing our wells to locate the cause of the elevated PFOA results. We have identified the wells with the higher levels and will be taking them offline until corrective action is taken. Florence Township will consult with our water engineer to develop a corrective action plan. The wells that have been tested and are in compliance will continue to provide the main source of our drinking water. We will continue to test the wells to ensure the safety of our residents. 3. Burlington County is advancing new transportation improvements to reduce congestion and guide truck traffic away from residential neighborhoods in Florence and Burlington Township.

The Burlington County Commissioners voted to authorize contracts with CME Associates, McMahon Associates and Colliers Engineering for design, engineering and construction administration services related to improvements planned for Daniels Way and John Galt Way in Florence, and Neck Road and Dulty's Lane in Burlington Township.

The specific improvements include:

- Extending Daniels Way from John Galt Way in Florence about a mile west to River Road (County Route 656);

- Adding a modern roundabout at the intersection of Daniels Way and John Galt Way;
- Adding a modern roundabout at the intersection of Neck Road and Dulty's Lane.

The extension of Daniels Way and the two planned roundabouts at the intersections of Daniels Way/John Galt Way and Dulty's Lane/Neck Road will help guide trucks to Route 130 via Dulty's Lane and John Galt Way and away from residential neighborhoods off Neck Road and Front Street and Delaware Avenue (County Route 656) in Florence. The roundabouts will also process traffic at those intersections without the need for signalized intersections. The improvements are expected to be paid for primarily with federal or state grants and funding from impact fees assessed on developers by the county and affected municipalities for off-site transportation improvements. Upon completion, Burlington County plans to take responsibility for Daniels Way and Florence Township will assume responsibility of Front Street.

4. **Notice of Special Meeting: The Commissioners of Fire District No. 1 in the Township of Florence, County of Burlington shall hold a special meeting on November 14th, 2022 between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. at Florence Twp. Fire District No. 1, 401 Firehouse Lane, Florence to secure voter approval for two items: Fire Department Extrication Equipment not to exceed \$180,000 and Fire Department Command Staff Vehicle not to exceed \$60,000. At said meeting the legal voters shall either approve or disapprove of said proposed capital projects and determine the amount of monies to be expended concerning the projects.**
5. **Trash Collection: Once-a-week trash collection has begun and will remain once-a-week until the first full week in April, 2023.**

9. **Township Projects:** The below projects have started. We apologize for any inconvenience these projects may cause the residents.

2022 Road Program: W. 2nd from Broad to Boulevard St.; W. 5th from Spring to Church; Winter St. from W. Front to W. 2nd and 3rd to 6th Street; Summer St. from W. Front to W. 3rd Street; Spring St. from W. Front to W. 2nd; Church St. from W. Front to W. 3rd; Zinc St. and Iron St. from W. Front to W. 3rd; Bike Path on 5th Street from Spruce to Eyre Street; and Main St. in Roebling from 2nd to 5th Avenues both sides.

9th Street: Some sidewalk work, curbing, milling and paving will begin next week. Please be aware there will be temporary no parking in these areas. Signs will be posted the day before work will be done.

11. **Police Department: If you have an emergency, dial 911. If it is a non-emergency requiring police response, call (609) 267-8300.** The police lobby window will be open Monday, Tuesday, Thursday & Friday from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Wednesday 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. and Saturday 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. If you require police assistance, please use the yellow call box located by the Municipal Building Main Lobby doors. 12. **Water Service Lines Letters:** In July 2021, P.L.2021, Ch.183 (Law) was enacted, requiring all community water systems to replace lead service lines in their service area within 10 years. Under the law, Florence Township is required to notify customers, non-paying consumers, and any off-site owner of a property (e.g., landlord) when it is known or unknown, if they are served by a lead service line. A letter was sent out on 9/1/22 to those residents this new law may affect. Note that per C.58:12A-41, section 2, the definition of a lead service line now includes lead connectors (lead gooseneck, lead pigtail, or other lead fitting) and galvanized service lines. Our service line inventory is available at www.florence-nj.gov. A service line is a portion of pipe that connects the water main to the building inlet. In Florence Township, the service line is owned entirely by the property owner. The service line materials are [lead/galvanized/unknown]. Florence Township is developing a lead service line replacement program. If you are planning to replace your lead service line, contact us at (609) 499-2518 prior to replacement so that we can coordinate our efforts.

13. **Recycling Center: The Recycling Center will be closed on Friday November 11th in observance of Veterans Day.**
